VISITING PROFESSORSHIPS FOR SENIOR LAWYERS

Spring and Autumn 2009
at Law Schools in Eastern Europe
and the Former Republics of the Soviet Union

The Center for International Legal Studies, in cooperation with law faculties in Eastern Europe and the former republics of the Soviet Union, will offer short-term appointments to as many as 80 senior lawyers from Common Law countries during spring 2009 and autumn 2009. A "senior lawyer" has at least 25 years of significant practice experience in the area in which he or she proposes to lecture. The term of teaching may be from two to six weeks and the length of appointment and dates of teaching are subject to negotiation between the appointee and the host university. The subject areas are not limited, but there is special interest in corporate and business law, intellectual property, litigation, arbitration, and criminal procedure. The purpose of the seminars will be to introduce particular areas of Common Law legal systems to the law students and junior faculty of the host university. These faculty appointments are **not** remunerated, and the appointee is responsible for his or her travel. The host university will assist with lodging. A one-week orientation seminar in Salzburg, Austria, is mandatory prior to assumption of the appointment. **Interviews will be conducted in San Francisco, Chicago, and Boston in June 2008.**
